JIIA Webinar: The political impact of European military presence in the Indo-Pacific

Europe has recently expressed an increasing strategic interest in the Indo-Pacific region. On 16th September 2021, the European Commission and the High Representative presented a Joint Communication on the EU's Indo-Pacific Strategy, which stated that the EU would increase its engagement in the region. The French government had previously published its "Indo-Pacific Strategy" in July, a few days after President Macron had visited Japan and French Polynesia. France has a sovereign and territorial interest in this region, with some naval and military presence. Germany has also undertaken a new challenge: it sent a warship to the South China Sea in August for the first time in almost two decades. Germany has deepened its interest in the Indo-Pacific ever since it released its "Policy guidelines for the Indo-Pacific region" in 2020. On the other hand, the UK has significantly strengthened its engagement with the Indo-Pacific after Brexit, dispatching a new aircraft carrier, HMS Queen Elizabeth, to the region. Furthermore, on 15th September, the US, the UK, and Australia announced that it would form a new trilateral security partnership called "AUKUS", which signals their deepening commitment in the region. Against such a backdrop, this webinar is intended to explore the strategic calculations behind and to assess the political impact of the growing military presence of Europe in the Indo-Pacific.
